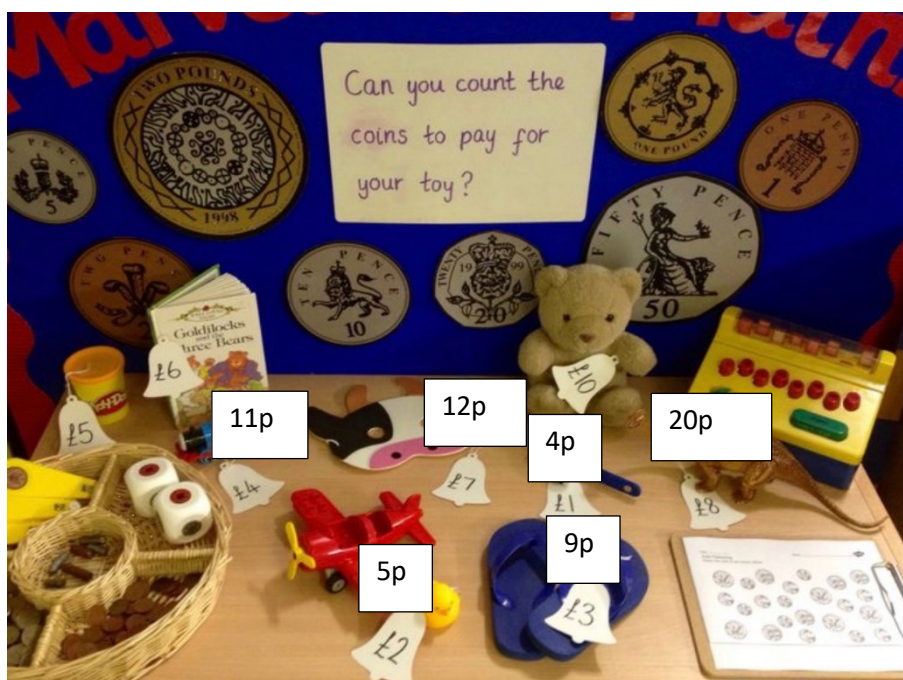

<p>Literacy</p>	<p>This week in Literacy you are going to create a fact book called 'All About Me' to send to your new teacher.</p> <p>Here she is:</p> <p>Her name is Miss Pylypiak Clancy, she is kind, caring and is really excited to meet you all.</p> <p>Your task today, is to create a front cover for your fact book. It will need to have:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A title 2. A picture of you 3. Your name <p>And it needs to look fun, so you can decorate it. Last week, I asked you to make your own shop and practise paying for items using money.

Today, I would like you to do this again, but this time we are going to use the items in your shop to practise taking away.



I would like you all to make sure the items in your shop are under 20p, like mine are above.


Then, I would like you to practise buying items and giving change from 20p. Like this:

$$20p - 5p = 15p$$

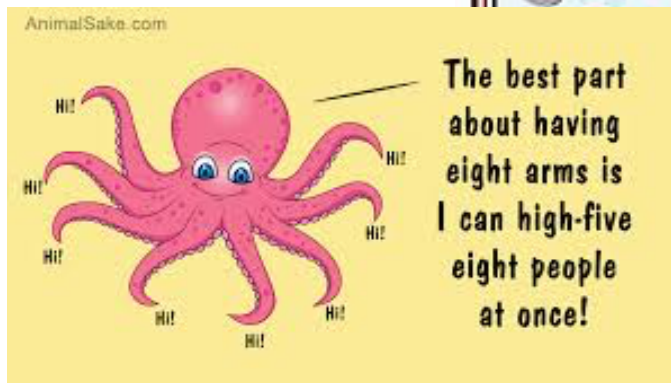
$$20_p - 9_p = 11_p$$

If you fancy a challenge, why not make the items in your shop under 5p, and practise giving the correct change from 50p. Like this:

$$50p - 20p = 30p$$
