
Numeracy



Today, we would love you to use your knowledge of fractions to help us with our take-away dilemma.

A fraction tells us how many parts of a whole we have.

To help you with the problems, remember, the pizza is delivered as a whole pizza. It then needs to be shared equally so everyone gets the same fraction.



On a Friday, lots of people like to order take-away meals for their dinner.

I know that Miss Starrs and Mrs Martin love to order pizzas, but sometimes they end up arguing about how much each person can have.

Miss Starrs always orders one big cheese and tomato pizza to share with Dean. Can you draw a pizza and split in into 2 equal parts to show Miss Starrs how to share it equally? That way her and Dean will both get half a pizza each.

Mrs Martin also orders one big pizza, but her family like to order mushrooms on theirs too. Mrs Martin has to make sure her pizza is split equally into 4 parts so she, Mr Martin, George and Harry all get the same amount. Can you draw a pizza and split it into four equal parts, so the Martin family can all have one quarter each?

How would you share a pizza equally with your family? Also, what flavour pizza would you have?


My Happy Place
