
Indoor treasure hunt

An indoor treasure hunt is a really fun way of developing your child's attention and listening skills.

The game can be played inside or outside. Ask your adult to hide a toy or teddy for you to find. If you are far away from the toy, your adult will say colder. As you get nearer, your adult will say warmer. When you find the toy, it's your turn to hide the toy for your adult to find.

Counting with Jack and the Beanstalk

Note to parents

You will need:

- 5 leaves numbered 1 to 5. You could use real leaves or make some out of paper.
- Some objects to count. Making small play dough balls is excellent for developing finger strength.
- A toy to climb the beanstalk. If you make large leaves your child could climb the beanstalk themselves!

Help your child to put the leaves in number order. Ask your child to count the correct number of objects onto each leaf. Finish by helping the toy climb the beanstalk counting as you go.



To support your child

Begin with numbers 1 to 3.

Add the correct number of dots to each leaf for your child to count onto.

To Challenge your child

Encourage your child to put the leaves in number order. Use numbered leaves to 10.

Make a Harp

Use a box, plastic tub or yogurt pot and some rubber bands to make your very own harp.

Then, have fun playing along to your favourite songs and rhymes.

You could even use different thicknesses of elastic bands to see how it changes the sounds made.
