Remember, you can check your answers, with an adult, when you have finished by scrolling down the page. 😊




A refugee is someone who has had to leave their home and country, as they are unable to stay. They might have to leave because there is a war or there might be a natural disaster, for example a volcano erupting or a terrible earthquake. Refugees are often unable to return to their home countries, as it would not be safe for them to do so.

Today, we would like you to design a suitcase to give to a refugee, who has had to leave their home. Think about what they might need, such as clothes for warmth, and food so they aren't hungry.

Here is Mrs Martin's design:



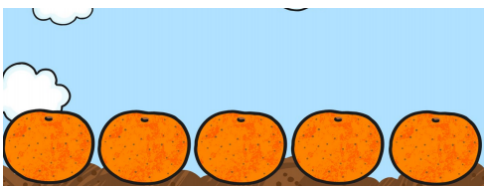
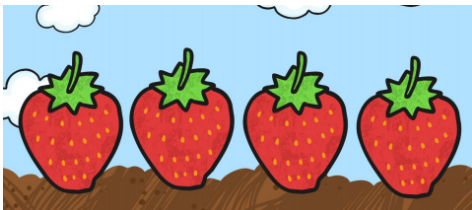
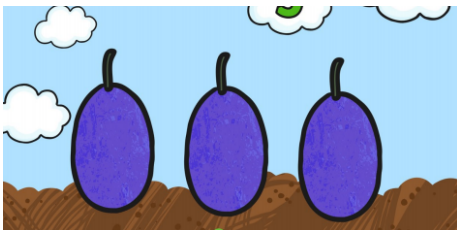
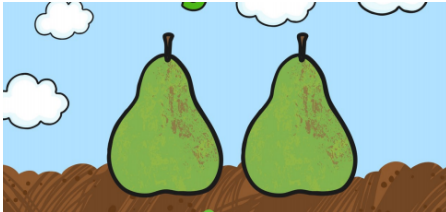
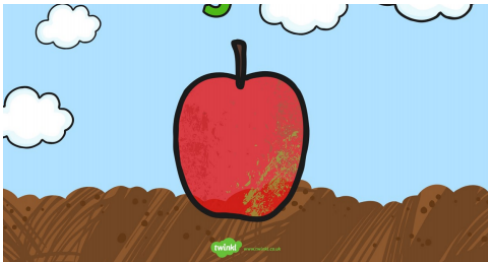
