

Now, use one of these ideas in a sentence, like this:


Each morning, they made delicious honey on toast for breakfast.

need to find some
items to sell, and give
them all a price,
like this:



Now, either use real money, or make some of your own to pay for your items.

Remember, you can pay by counting the correct amount of lp coins, they look this this:




Or, you can use different coins that add up to the same amount, like this.

A 5p coin is worth the same as five 1p coins.



Two 5p coins are worth the same as a 10p coin.



Two 10p coins are worth the same as a 20p coin.


