

	Remember, when we write letters that start with the same sound, we call it 'Alliteration'. So today, you are writing an alliterative sentence, wow, that does sound clever doesn't it!						

Numeracy

Today we are going to practise our times tables.

Remember 'x' means 'lots of'. So, 2×5 is the same as 2 lots of 5.

Here are 2 lots of 5. They make 10 altogether. We can write it as $2 \times 5 = 10$

First, I would like you to practise your 2, 5, and 10 times tables on Times Table Rockstar's.


Then see how many you can remember by writing them down. Start with your 2x tables first.

Here are mine, I couldn't remember them all. Do you think you can beat me?
