


Hello Year 2!

Our first lesson is maths

Yesterday, you investigated shape properties for the shape inspector. Today, she has another task for you...
Inspecting shapes in your own house!

My boss needs to know how many shapes people have at home. I suggested she ask Year 2 to help, as you are all so kind!

Can you record how many of each shape you can find in your house?




Set a timer for 7 minutes. Look around your house and record how many of each shape you can see. For example, a mirror is a square, a mug's rim is a circle, the lid of a box is a rectangle....

Remember we mark a tally like this:

For every 1 you count you draw one line



Once you get to five, cross across the first four lines. Repeat this for every five lines.



In Year 1 you used you used to say....1,2,3,4...close the gate on number 5!

When the time is up, total each tally and write the number next to it. Try to find at least one of each shape.

Next today, is writing

You wrote some fantastic book reviews yesterday! Well done!

Today, we are going to use our writing skills to write the blurb of a book.

The blurb is found on the back of the book and tells you just enough about the book to make you want to read it.

The blurb needs to be so exciting to make sure someone will pick up your book and read it!


Here are my top tips for writing a blurb:

1. Keep it short.
2. Use questions and exclamation marks to interest the reader.
3. Make sure your writing grabs the reader's attention.
4. Don't give away the ending of the story!

Here is an example of a blurb for Artemis Fowl by Eoin Colfer.

Have you heard about the new master criminal on the scene?

12-year-old Artemis Fowl! Kidnapping a fairy starts out easy for Artemis, but he soon discovers he's taken captive Captain Holly Short! She's part of an armed and extremely dangerous LEPrecon Unit. Artemis should be able to handle things as long as they play by the rules.....

Our last lesson is geography

If someone had never made that journey, how would they know where to go?


I want you to draw a map of a journey you make. Remember, it needs to be clear and neat so people can read it easily.
