Did you know?

During May half term it is Whitsun week and yesterday it was Pentecost. Pentecost is an important day in the Christian Calendar.

Read the information below and in your books, I would like you to create a fact file about the Pentecost.

- Pentecost is a Christian celebration fifty days after Good Friday.
- It is said to be the beginning of the Christian Church.

### **How Pentecost Came About**

After Jesus had risen from the dead, He met with the disciples quite often.

After 40 days, it was time for Jesus to join his Father in Heaven. Before he left, he was on a mountainside, talking to his disciples. He told them that they had the job of telling people all over the world, that God loved them. Jesus said it would be a hard job, but He would send a gift to help them to do it.

Then, Jesus was taken up to Heaven.



### **The Gift of the Holy Spirit**

One day, the disciples were together when there was a sudden sound of a mighty wind in the room. Then, flames landed on each of their heads, but no one was burned.

The disciples were amazed.

Then, they started talking in different languages! The disciples had been filled with the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit was the gift from God!

People nearby heard the disciples talking in different languages.





Peter, the disciple, came to speak to the crowd, and said,



"Fellow Jews and people here in Jerusalem. We have received the Holy Spirit from God. You too can receive the Holy Spirit. You must be baptised. Then, you too can receive this wonderful gift!"

That day, three thousand people were baptised. The disciples started to travel the world, telling people about God's message of love. This was the first day of the Christian Church.



#### Did You Know?

- At Pentecost, the colour red is a symbol of the flames that appeared on the disciples' heads.
- A dove is a sign of the Holy Spirit because when Jesus was baptised, a dove appeared, bringing the Holy Spirit to Jesus.
