

Note to Parents

Dough Disco is a fun activity, using play dough, which helps to develop children's fine motor muscles and pencil grip.



Here is a simple way to make play dough using warm water. I would stay away from adding food colouring as it does get messy!


Click on this link to go to the dough disco. Don't worry if you don't have any dough. You can use your invisible dough instead.

Grow a Bean in a Bag

You will need cotton wool balls or kitchen paper, a resealable freezer bag and some beans, any type will grow.

- Dip your cotton balls into water and place them all the way across the bottom of the bag.
- Count out 4 beans and drop them in your bag. Make sure they have space to grow.
- Seal your bag tight to hold in the moisture.
- You could even tape your bag to the window where the beans will get lots of light.



This activity can be done in a clear plastic cup too but you will need to keep moistening the cotton wool.

Check your beans every day to see how they change.

Note to Parents

Soak the beans overnight before planting to speed up the growing process.

Teddy Numbers

First, sing 'Once I Caught a Fish Alive.' Don't forget to count your fingers as you sing along.

Have fun counting cakes to give to a very hungry teddy. Remember careful counting. Use one number name for each cake.
