Funky Fingers


Using playdough can you make a shell? You have to roll it like a worm first. Let me see your playdough shells.

What do you think is holding the strawberry in that position?


Where is the snail's shell?

Where do you think the snail will go next?




Pattern

Can you make a pattern with the fruit from the fruit bowl, or the biscuits in the biscuit tin? Try this one: 'banana, banana, grape, grape' or 'apple, pear, orange, apple, pear, orange'. How many more can you make?



Use the Internet or books to look at patterns on animals. Look at tigers, zebras, snakes, giraffes and cheetahs. What other animals can you find with patterns? Can you draw any of the patterns?



Ask a friend to clap a repeating pattern for you to copy. Repeat it back to them. Then, you clap a repeating pattern and see if they can repeat it. Try this with some other body percussion, including tapping on your legs, knees, shoulders and head. You could tap your hands, knees, head, hands, knees, head.

Can you think of other animals that have a shell? Draw a picture of all the animals you can think of that have a shell. I can think of 3. Can you think of anymore? You will win 10 Dojo points if you email me a picture.
