



Science: Seasons To complete across the week.	Task 1 A set of posters - one poster for each season Spring Summer Autumn Winter	<p>Show off your knowledge! Create a poster for each season. Use a range of pictures/materials/collage/words/sentences. Let your imagination run wild! Please send me a photo or email it to me if you have completed it on the computer. 	Task 2 (optional) - Seasons Dance	<p>Create a dance that symbolises one of the seasons, or all of them if you wish. Record the dance and send it via email. 😊 yearone@blowers.dudley.sch.uk</p> <p>Example: Spring Dance</p> <p>During the spring, lots of flowers grow. Think about how a flower grows from a bulb or a seed. Create a sequence of movements to represent a growing flower. Remember to start as small as a seed or bulb and then slowly stretch different parts of your body. You could use your legs as the roots, your body as the stem and your arms as the leaves or petals.</p> <p>Winter Dance</p>

		<p>Think about these winter activities: • Building a snowman • Rolling and throwing a snowball • Putting on warm clothes to go out in the snow • Making snow angels. Choose one action from each activity and combine them into a wintery dance.</p> <p>Summer Dance</p> <p>Lots of people go to the beach in the summer. They might play lots of games, including beachball. Think about the movements in a game of beachball (throwing and catching at different heights, hitting the ball back to another player, etc.). Put some of the movements together to make a short dance.</p> <p>Autumn Dance</p> <p>In the autumn, the leaves change colour and fall from the trees. Think of some words to describe the different ways that the leaves move as they fall to the ground (e.g. twisting, turning, shooting, gliding, etc.). Can you be an autumn leaf falling to the ground? See if you can move your body in a different way each time.</p>

Bees flying from flower to flower,

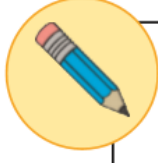
A rainbow appears during the fresh shower!

Easter Egg Nests Recipe

You will need:



- 🥚 chocolate
- 🥚 cornflakes
- 🥚 chocolate mini eggs
- 🥚 butter
- 🥚 paper bun cases
- 🥚 golden syrup
- 🥚 water

Method:

1. Put the chocolate, butter and golden syrup in a bowl.
2. Stir over simmering water until smooth.
3. Add the cornflakes and stir.
4. Put the mixture into 12 paper bun cases.
5. Add three chocolate mini eggs to each nest.
6. Leave to cool in the fridge until they are set.

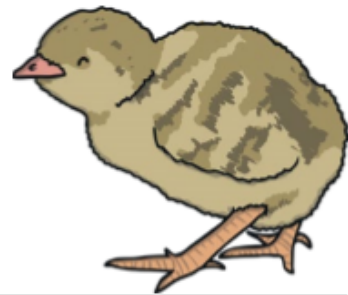
