

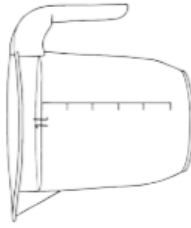
Numeracy task 2:
