- A range of punctuation () , : ; ? ! –


Write for 20 – 30 minutes – feel free to email me your descriptions, Mrs Williams and I would love to read some of your efforts.

- 1 **Ing** - Grabbing her bag, the woman stormed out of the shop.
 - 2 **Similes** - Like a predator stalking its prey, the robber approached the boy.
 - 3 **Preposition** - Under the dark clouds, the lamppost gleamed brightly.
 - 4 **Adverb** - Cautiously, the girl reached out to touch the creature.
 - 5 **Connective** - Despite the weather, we plunged into the sea.
 - 6 **Ed** - Petrified, the dog stood rooted to the spot.
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Our next task is Maths.

Here's some puzzles to stretch your mathematical muscles.

In these triangular arithmagons, the pair of numbers at the end of each side are added together to give the number between them. Find the missing numbers in these puzzles. The puzzles get progressively harder in each section.



So finally – Some Science. We are going to be looking at animals and their habitats during this term.

As a starter activity I thought it would be good to each produce an information factfile / factsheet about an animal or insect of your choice. It could be a favourite animal or one you are particularly interested in. Your factfile can include drawings, writing and fun facts about your animal of choice. You can use the internet to help you or books that you may have at home. Include facts about the way this animal lives, what it eats, where it lives and how it may be well adapted to its environment.

Your factsheet could be computer produced or by using colours, crayons and felt tips – it's your chance to get creative! I've included some examples below.
