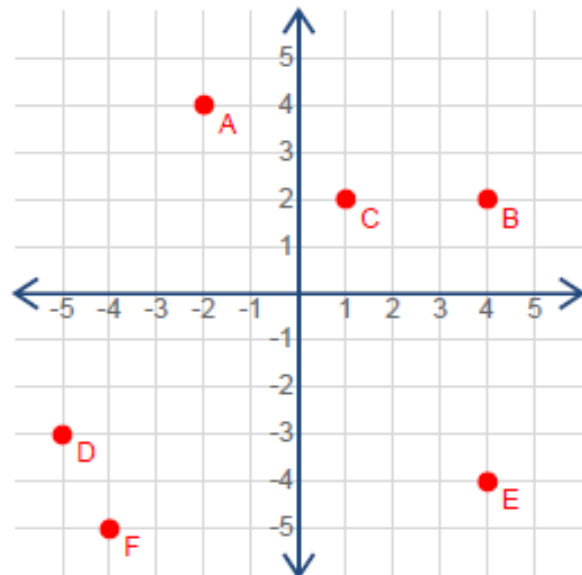
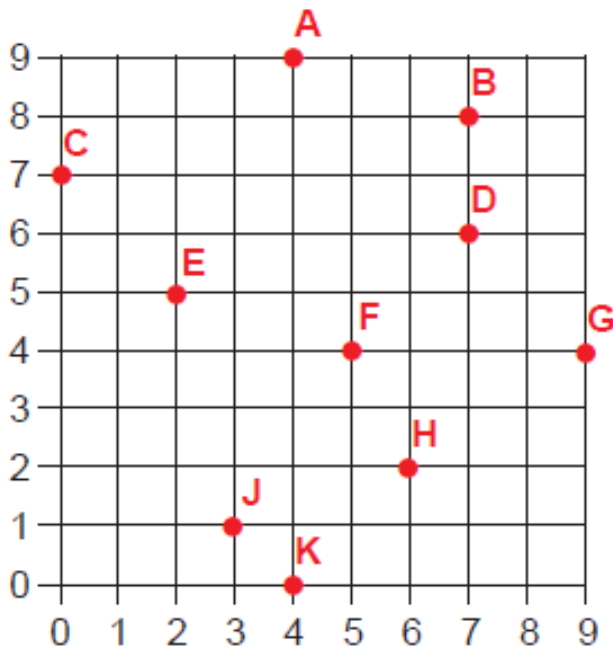

English – Handwriting

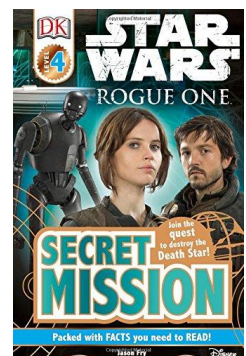
It is really important that we keep up a high standard of handwriting. I have received emails from a few of you to show of your excellent writing but I know a lot of you can write much neater so let practise today.

The Battle of Scarif begins as a hastily planned raid by rebels disobeying orders and becomes a fight to preserve freedom in the galaxy. Cassian Ander, Rebel Captain, and Jyn Erso lead their team – team Rogue One – to Scarif with a group of rebel soldiers. They are on a desperate mission: find the Death Star plans and deliver them into the hands of the rebel council.

Baze, a hot-headed warrior, and Chirrut, a spiritual warrior monk, target Imperial troopers, allowing Jyn and Cassian to infiltrate the Imperial base. They hope to upload the plans to their stolen Imperial cargo ship, which Bodhi, defector from the Empire, will fly to safety. It is a desperate gamble, but the team isn't alone: many brave rebels risk their lives. Rebel soldiers battle Imperial vehicles on the beach as X-wings and TIEs duel overhead, buying time for the rebel team. When the mission starts to go wrong – as missions so often do – Jyn frantically takes the Death Star plans to a communications tower, hoping to transmit them from there.
