Our first lesson today, is maths

Warm up your maths brains by telling someone in your household your number bonds to 20. You could also play 'SPLAT!' if you would like!

Get set...GO!

What a week we have had in your shop! You have been fantastic shopkeepers.

Can you remember what maths money skills we have practised this week?



That's right.... recognising coins, adding prices and finding change. Woah... what a busy week!

It is time to open our shops up again...



Today, we are going to help customers to find the difference between prices.

Remember, we find the difference by subtracting. For example...



Excuse me, can you help me?

I want to buy a present for my son, but I can't decide.

What is the difference in price between the book and the notepad?

Thanks!



Looking at my shop, I can see the teddy is 20p, and the notepad is 9p.

Then, I make my subtraction number sentence to find the difference.



$$20p - 9p = 11p$$

I can tell the customer, the difference between the teddy and the notepad is 11p.

So, the notepad is 11p cheaper than the teddy.

Remember, biggest number first when subtracting! Plus, don't forget the pence (p)

You could use a fair swap to help you subtract.

5 customers have come into your shop. Each customer chooses two items.

They ask you to find the difference in price of the two items.

For each customer, write the subtraction number sentence, like I did.

There is a challenge from another tricky customer below. Off you go shopkeepers!

## Our next lesson is spelling, punctuation and grammar

I can't make out what it says because of all the mistakes.

Can you email me a picture of the corrected sentences so that I can read it?

Keep an eye out for... for missing capital letters, for proper nouns and at the beginning of a sentence, punctuation

(! ? .) and spelling of tricky words and Kite Challenge words..

### Next up...writing!

In this lesson, we are going to practise using commas in a list.



A comma can be used to separate nouns within a list.

Can you read this sentence out loud?

In my dip box there are sweets, pencils, lollipops and rubbers.

Now read this sentence....

In my dip box there are sweets pencils lollipops and rubbers.

My sentence without commas sounds funny, doesn't it?!

Your task today, is to use commas to list the items in three rooms in your house.

Here is one of my sentences...

In the living room there is a sofa, television, and lamp.



If you would like to stretch yourself, you could use adjectives to make your writing more interesting, like this...

In the warm living room, there is a soft sofa, shiny television and massive, slate-grey lamp.

Can you spot the alliteration in my sentence?

If you find this tricky, begin by writing all of your items in a numbered list first and then try to add the commas.

Send me a picture of your sentences for 3 dojos.
