

Maths	<p><u>Warm up your maths brains today by:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Practising your 2x, 3x, 5x and 10x tables on times table rock stars. • Practise using money playing this game: https://natwest.mymoneysense.com/students/students-5-8/coin-cruncher/ <p>Shape Find examples of 3D shapes around your house. Record what you find in your yellow book. Just like you did with the 2D shapes earlier this week.</p> <p><u>Challenge:</u> Jack has made a cube using 12 sticks and 8 balls of modelling clay.</p>  <p>What shape could he make with 6 sticks and 4 balls of clay?</p> <p>4 long sticks, 8 short sticks and 8 balls of clay?</p>

Reading	<p>Complete the reading challenge (attached below) and answer the questions in your yellow books. Start on question 1 and stop when they get too hard.</p>
Writing	<p>Write the middle of an exciting story.</p>  <p>"What's that up ahead?" Hal squints hard as he sees A shape that is pale and all round, like a cheese!</p> <p>There are craters and mountains and dust that is grey</p> <p>Could this be the Sun that we see in the day?</p> <p>Today, we are going to write the next part of our story. I want you to start by</p>

	<p>describing what George can see. For example; the moon. Remember to use adjectives and similes.</p> <p><u>Simile starters</u> The moon was as big as... The moon was as round as... The moon was as magnificent as... The moon was as dusty as...</p> <p><u>Remember:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Only write about this picture. ● Check your punctuation. ● Re-read your writing to check it makes sense. <p>If you find this a little tricky write a simple sentence using your phonics telling me what is happening in the picture.</p>
RE:	<p>Easter</p> <p>Write the next part of your story, for plot points 3 and 4 attached below.</p> <p><u>Plot point 3</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Tell me what Jesus is thinking, e.g. <i>'Oh no, this is awful! I must trust everything will be okay!'</i> ● Tell me how Jesus feels and why. Use the emotions wheel attached below to help you, e.g. <i>Jesus felt heartbroken and resentful because his friend had betrayed him.</i> <p><u>Plot point 4</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● What did the crowd say and how did they say it? e.g. <i>The vast crowd chanted, "punish him, punish him, punish him!"</i>. <p>You could use one of these words to help you: cried, gasped, chanted, shouted, cheered</p> <p>If you find this a little tricky write a sentence or use your sounds to spell some key words to describe picture 3 and picture 4.</p>
