Today we are going to learn the alphabet through song and movement. Sing along and try and copy the movement, it will help you remember the letters.

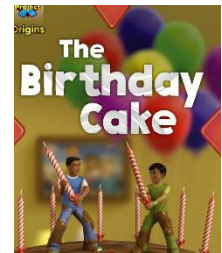

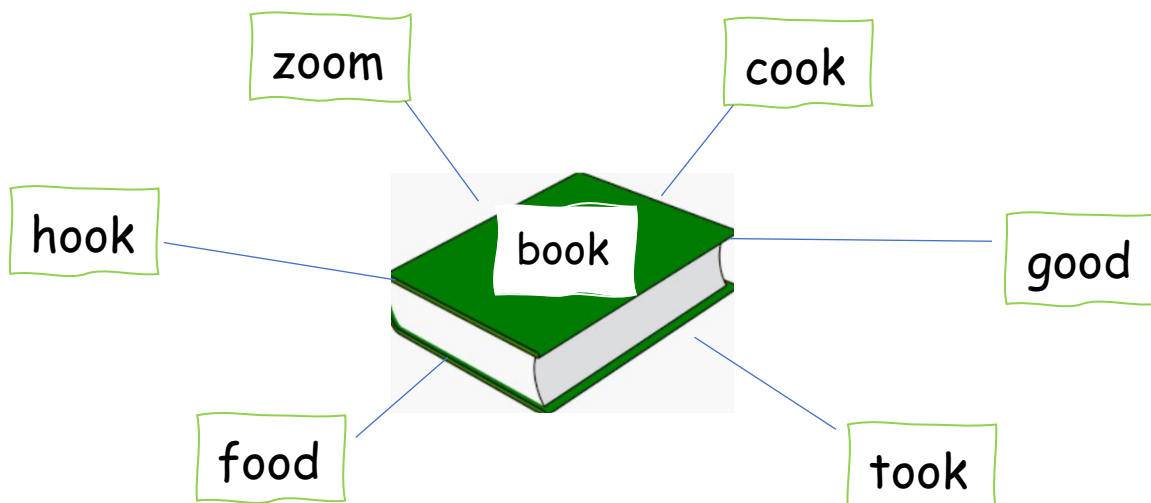
## Phonics

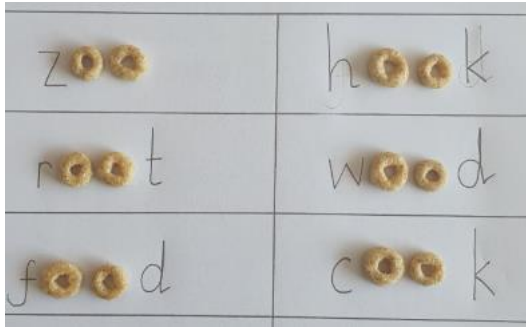
Today we are going to learn **oo**. Do you remember the sound? This is the naughty digraph that tries to trick us as it has two sounds.
