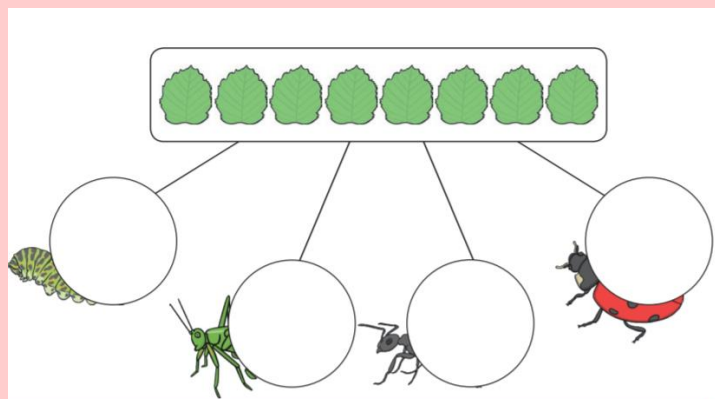
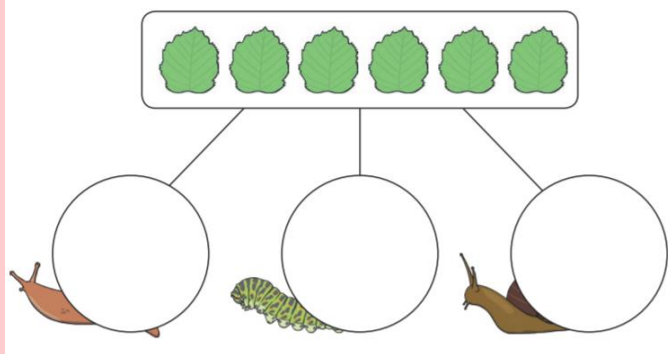
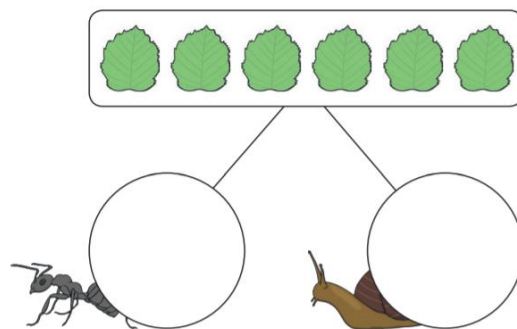
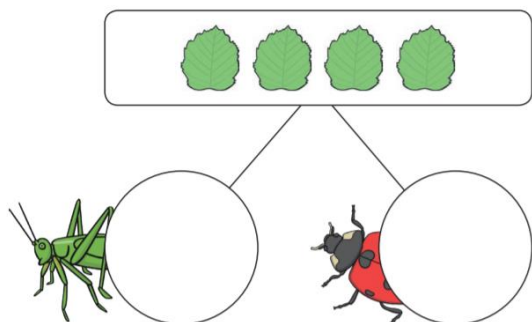
Can you write 3 sentences? After seeing some lovely examples of your 'I can see' sentences I know you will be able to. Each sentence must start with I like to....

All you need is some paper cut into triangles, string and colouring crayons.

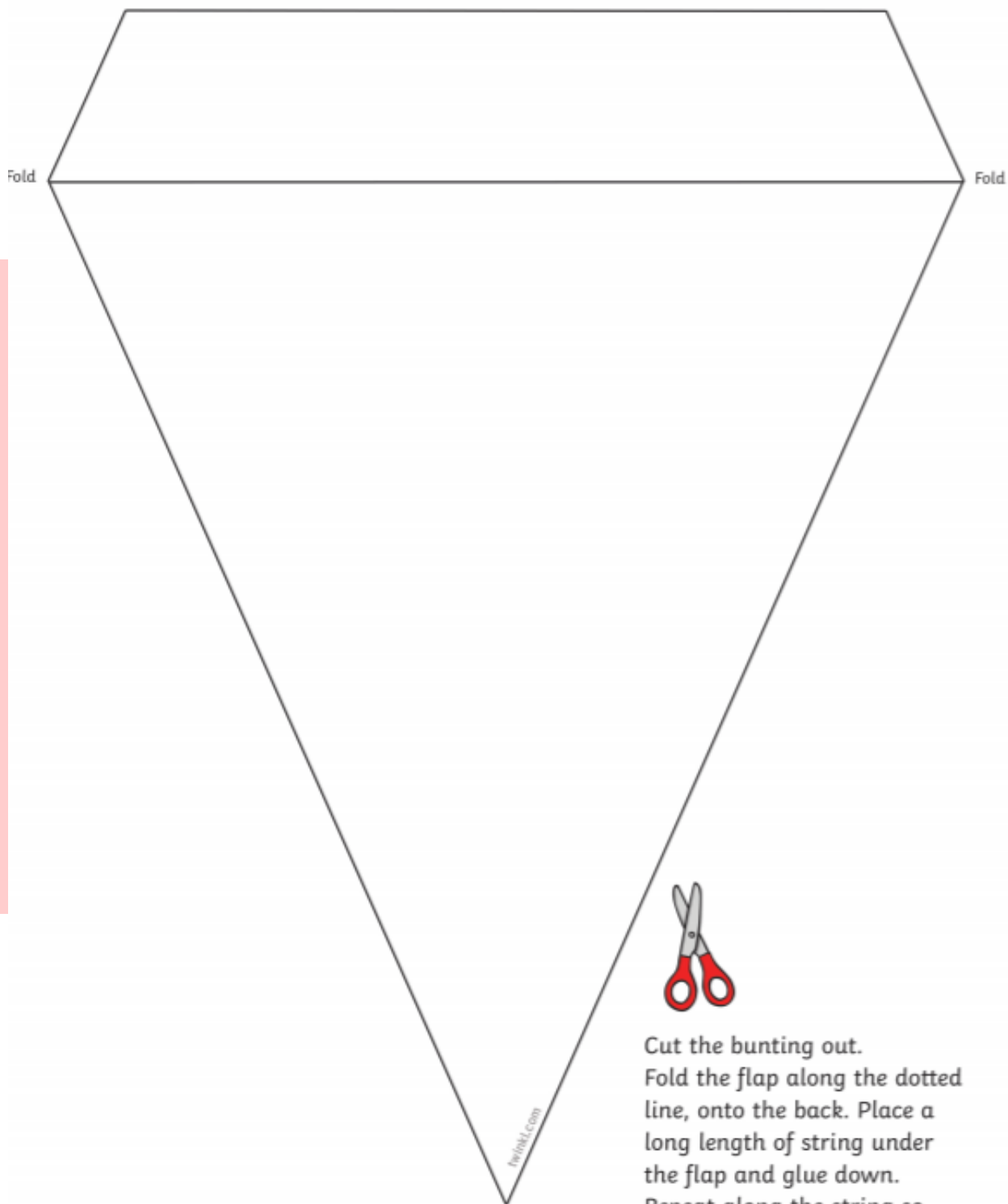
Molly and I had fun with red and blue paint over the weekend and we made this bunting. Why do you think we picked red, white and blue as the colours? I would love to see yours.
