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Did you know that tomorrow is Helen Keller day?

Helen Keller was the first blind and deaf person to get a degree. That is a special qualification you work for when you get older.

Being deaf means you can't hear, and being blind means, you can't see. It must be very strange not having 2 of your senses to help you learn.

Try closing your eyes, and covering your ears, how does it feel?

Helen had to learn to communicate in different ways as she could not hear or see people. She might have used **braille**. This is where you use your sense of touch to feel patterns and dots on a page. The dots and patterns are used to represent words.

When people are unable to hear, they use their hands to communicate. It is called <u>sign language.</u>






















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
