


Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> July 2020

Yesterday, I told you about Islay's three favourite stories. Do you remember what they were called? Here is a little clue...

I think, we could have some fun today, and change this part of the story by thinking of different things the bears could eat for breakfast.

banana sandwiches


Now, use one of these ideas in a sentence, like this:

Try and use some adjectives to make your sentence more interesting. Can you spot mine?


Today, we are going to practise using money to buy items.

First, I would like you to set up your own shop. You will need to find some items to sell, and give them all a price, like this:



Now, either use real money, or make some of your own to pay for your items.

Remember, you can pay by counting the correct amount of 1p coins, they look like this:



Or, you can use different coins that add up to the same amount, like this.

A **5p** coin is worth the same as five 1p coins.



Two 5p coins are worth the same as a **10p** coin.



Two 10p coins are worth the same as a **20p** coin.



Now, using post it notes, or paper and sticky tape, label these parts on your body.


eyes, nose, ears, mouth, head, neck, back, arms, fingers, legs, hands,

1. Why might Wolf not be wearing those clothes now?

**(under the covers) in Grandma's bed**

**Accept any sensible prediction linked to the text, e.g. I think that Wolf might have gone back home or hidden in the woods.**
